How to Keep Cut Flowers Fresh:

Mix equal parts of water and soda pop (7-up, Fresca, Sprite, Mountain Dew, et al). Add a ½ teaspoon of bleach to each quart of mixture. Place the flower in the mix. Michigan State University horticulturalists say this will extend the life of cut flowers by providing sugar for nourishment and combating bacterial growth.
